#### 95 2020 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate: Barolo, Barbaresco & More, Apr 2024

The G.D. Vajra 2020 Barolo Bricco delle Viole is a very pretty wine with brightness and delicate aromas that remain etched and defined. You get dried violet or lilac, tart cherry, cranberry, lavender essence, rosemary and other perfumed Mediterranean nuances. Bricco delle Viole finishes dry, and the tannins are on the powdery side, giving the wine medium weight and a lean mid-palate.

#### 95 2020 - Kerin O'Keefe, kerinokeefe.com, Feb 2023

Fragrant and refined, the G.D. Vajra 2020 Bricco delle Viole has heady aromas of wild berry, fragrant purple flower and camphor. It's polished and sav with great red cherry and raspberry fruit flavors accented by spicy notes of ground clove and white pepper. Tightly knit, fine-grained tannins offer sea support.

#### 96 2020 - James Suckling, Jan 2024

Rose petals, racy plums and cherries with subtle white pepper spices and mineral. The tight, fullbodied palate is grasped by fine, minerally textured tannins. Powerful, ample and vertical in the middle before a lengthy, mineral finish.

#### 96 2020 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, 2020 Barolo: Selective Excellence, Jan 2024

The 2020 Barolo Bricco delle Viole, Vajra's flagship, is very fine. Dark cherry, kirsch, blood orange, spice and lavender are nicely amplified. The 2020 is gracious and elegant, but its youthful Nebbiolo tannins will require some time to soften. The 2020 is another wine that captures my keen interests with its sublime balance. I would be thrilled to own it.

#### 17.5 **2020 - Jancis Robinson, Barolo 2019, Nov 2023**

A site at 380–490 m that faces south. Many different picks. Lots of clay but cooled from the west. In Alba museum there's an inscription about this site. To be released mid 2024. Gorgeous roundness after a light animal scent. A ballet dancer with muscles – including some delicacy.

#### 97 2019 - Jeff Porter, WineEnthusiast, Jan 2024

Lifted aromas of crushed cherries and raspberries mixed with blue violets and savory spice on the nose. Super-fine tannins with crushed chalk; very floral with a bright and lifted palate. Mouth-watering acidity. Alluring, captivating, energetic and precise.

#### 96 **2019 - Stephanie Johnson, Wine&Spirits, Mar 2024**

Notes of lavender, violet and fennel weave through flavors of dark cherry and plum in this elegant wine. The flavors feel deep and lush yet somehow weightless, the layers unfolding over velvety tannins in a long, balanced finish.

#### 17.5+ 2019 - Jancis Robinson, Barolo 2019, Dec 2023

Smells earthy, like the damp winter depth of rich dark soil of an oak forest. Smells of violets. Mushrooms crushed underfoot. Tastes of tea leaves and tamarind and dried sour cherries and cranberries. Tastes of the bitter red-gold sere of autumn. Tannins that, even now, so young, feel like mist and salt ripping down the mountain. Tendrils of woodsmoke on the finish. Haunting, even if embryonic.

#### 96 2020 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate: Barolo, Barbaresco & More, Apr 2024

The G.D. Vajra 2020 Barolo Ravera reveals wild forest berry, cherry, licorice root and sweet summer fruit. The effect is focused or chiseled thanks to animating acidity and pinpoint fruit flavors. Located in the village of Novello, Ravera benefits from open panoramas and cooler temperatures from the mountains. These factors make this cru one of the most promising in this era of climate change. This is a Barolo for the purists.

#### 95 2020 - Kerin O'Keefe, kerinokeefe.com, Feb 2023

The 2020 Ravera from G.D. Vajra is taut and savory, featuring aromas and flavors of juicy wild strawberry, cherry, forest floor, blood orange and star a salty note signals the close while close-grained tannins grip the close. Give this a few more years to fully develop.

#### 95 2020 - James Suckling, Jan 2024

Blood orange, savory plum and clove characters with a touch of haw fruit and white pepper. Close-knit, chalky tannins on the palate with a structured full body and a zesty, tense finish. Long, complex, austere and expansive.

#### 94+ 2020 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, 2020 Barolo: Selective Excellence, Jan 2024

The 2020 Barolo Ravera is a gorgeous, aromatically exotic wine that is going to need time to be at its best. Orange peel, spice, menthol and kirsch all lift from the glass, conveying a good deal of ethereal Nebbiolo beauty before the tannins kick in. There's gorgeous weight and substance here, in the mid-weight style of the year. More than anything else, I admire the balance.

#### 17++ 2020 - Jancis Robinson, Barolo 2019, Nov 2023

Three different picks at different altitudes. A site towards Monforte that is relied upon to yield the power of Monforte and the elegance of Barolo. Clay and silt. To be released mid 2024. Powerful and muscular. Lots of tannin.

#### 97 2019 - Stephanie Johnson, Wine&Spirits, Mar 2024


This wine feels coiled at first, its dark cherry flavors encased in rigid, ferrous tannins that gradually relax as the cherry fruit turns brighter with raspberry highlights. Cool notes of thyme and bay leaf rise up as vibrant acidity surges through the flavors, intertwining with the tensile tannins to create a wine of impressive structure and freshness.

#### 96 2019 - Jeff Porter, WineEnthusiast, Jan 2024

Aromas of fresh and macerated black cherries mixed with medicinal herbs and dried flowers lift from the glass. The well-structured palate yields a mix of tart raspberries, plums, herbs, mint and savory spices. Firm tannins give the wine a super structure that shows its depth, power and age ability.

The 2020 Coste delle Rose is a stunner, starting with its heady aromas of dog rose, lavender, juniper and eucalyptus. Combining finesse and density, th polished palate is delicious, delivering juicy red cherry, strawberry compote, blood orange, grilled sage and star anise alongside tightly knit, velvet [...].

#### 94 **2020 - James Suckling, Jan 2024**

White pepper, dried roses, berries and mineral on the nose. Really elegant and chalky on the palate [...] and a linear finish. Pure and driven.

#### 93 2020 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, 2020 Barolo: Selective Excellence, Jan 2024

The 2020 Barolo Coste di Rose is an attractive, mid-weight wine. Black cherry, lavender, spice, menthol and licorice are nicely woven together. The Coste di Rose [...] offers tons of sheer appeal, in a sensual, open-knit style that can be enjoyed with minimal cellaring.

#### 17 2020 - Jancis Robinson, Barolo 2019, Nov 2023

Sandy site between Cannubi and Bussia at 360–380 m. Vajra's lowest. It's a historic vineyard from Aldo's parents that is fenced to stop grape pilfering. To be released mid 2024. Truly floral aroma. Very fruity, expressive and flattering. [...] Lots of energy. Relatively light.

#### 96 2019 - Jeff Porter, WineEnthusiast, Jan 2024

This wine lifts from the glass with poise and confidence from the get go. Macerated and dried raspberries capture the attention, as wildflowers, herbs and truffles draw you deep into the glass. The textured palate offers layers of mixed red berries that are framed by fine, yet firm tannins and crunchy acidity. The wine ends withV tart red fruits, mint and dusty chalk.

#### 95 **2019 - Stephanie Johnson, Wine&Spirits, Mar 2024**

This wine from the sandy soils of the Coste di Rose MGA ofters a high-toned, red-fruited counterpart to Vajra's darker and violet-tinged Barolo from Bricco delle Viole. Notes of tangy orange peel and fresh rose petal punctuat the wine's lively red cherry, raspberry and pomegranate flavors. With buoyant acidity and youthful vigor, it has a immediate appeal and will sustain its freshness over the next decade.

#### 17.5+ 2019 - Jancis Robinson, Barolo 2019, Dec 2023

So intensely, fragrantly spicy that the first breath and sip is like inhaling a newly-opened jar of Hungarian sweet paprika and Baharat. The fruit is also fragrant; fine, almost a little shy, like a violin solo in an enormous, empty concert hall. Hibiscus, raspberry, blood orange, red roses. A delicate, very fine-boned wine that, for the moment, is only peeping out from behind the brooding screen of fine-grained tannins, which, as Giuseppe Vajra points out, protrude like a pinch on the tip of the tongue rather than sitting at the back of the mouth. 24 hours later, the tannins feel more like cashmere, allowing the fruit to come forward and sing sweetly and softly.

#### 94 2020 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate: Barolo, Barbaresco & More, Apr 2024

You can't beat this value. The G.D. Vajra 2020 Barolo Albe is buttoned up with fresh primary fruit, and the wine does not have that hint of over-ripeness that is found across this vintage. The fruit is dark and savory, and there is a big mineral component to match, but the bouquet is nicely redolent of dark currant, plum, granite and a raspy dry note that brings crushed shale to mind. The tannins are quite impactful, and they give this wine extra runway for moderate bottle aging.

#### 92 2020 - Kerin O'Keefe, kerinokeefe.com, Feb 2023

The friendly 2020 Barolo Albe is all about sheer drinking pleasure. Glossy and savory, it doles out ripe red cherry, blood orange, pink peppercorn and tea accompanied by lithe tannins. It's ready but will also offer several years of enjoyment.

This is a bright and lively Barolo showing sliced oranges, raspberries, crushed stones and rose petals on the nose. [...] sharp acidity and tight tannins. Lots of energy.

Described as 'the first post-modernist Barolo'. Great to drink young yet ageworthy, too. Blend of three high vineyards, Fossati, Le Volte and Coste di Vergne in the commune of Barolo, each vinified separately. [...] Intense, mineral and racy. Edgy and quite modern [...].

#### 91 2019 - Stephanie Johnson, Wine&Spirits, Mar 2024

An easy-drinking choice for by-the-glass programs, Albe's juicy cherry and plum flavors are round and fleshy, accented by hints of menthol and licorice.

#### 94 2019 - Jeff Porter, WineEnthusiast, Jan 2024

Stunning in its purity, freshness and vibrancy, the Albe Barolo from the venerable Vajra family is a beauty. Aromas of fresh cherries, wild strawberries, rosebuds, wild herbs, underbrush and subtle chalky notes waft from the glass. The generous palate showcases the tart red fruits Nebbiolo is known for, but at a higher gear followed by more savory flavors finishing with well-integrated tannins and vibrant acidity.

#### 94 2019 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Italy, Piedmont: Barolo, Barbaresco & More, Aug 2023

This is certainly one of the most popular and versatile wines made in Italy, and deservedly so. The well-priced G.D. Vajra 2019 Barolo Albe shows some ripe fruit and softness with cherry, dried raspberry and crushed rose. This vintage is similar in character to the 2016 release [...]. The mouthfeel is polished and long, affording accessibility and complexity too.

The 2022 Dolcetto d'Alba Coste & Fossati is a powerful, deep wine. Black cherry, plum, leather, grilled herbs, gravel, lavender and spice lend notable complexity. Imposing tannins and rich fruit give this a very serious feel. The 2022 is a wine for the dinner table.

#### 17 2022 - Jancis Robinson, Dec 2023

Vivid fruit sheathed in firm, muscular, sandy tannins. Dust and rosehips. Sour cherry. Vibrant fruit with a delicate forest-floor savoury outline and a breathy whisper of florals. The finish draws down tight and then circles back into the brightness of its fruit. Great sapidity! Appetising and full of life, and even better after the bottle was left (deliberately) open for 24 hours.

#### 92 2022 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Italy, Piedmont: Barolo, Barbaresco & More Aug 2023

This wine is all about fun and good cheer. "Every day that you drink Dolcetto is a good day," says Isidoro Vaira. The organic 2022 Dolcetto d'Alba Coste & Fossati reveals rich, dark fruit with a pronounced sweet side. There is soft cherry, blackberry and crème de cassis. The wine is quite plump and juicy in character, setting it up for pairing with wood-oven pizza.

#### 92 2021 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Italy, Piedmont: Barolo, Barbaresco & More Aug 2023

The organic G.D. Vajra 2021 Dolcetto d'Alba Coste & Fossati offers raw, punchy flavors with big intensity and loads of soft dark fruit. There is a wild factor to this wine that you always get with the best expressions of this much-beloved grape. A warming climate has actually helped Dolcetto, as this variety does very well during the warm summer season. An older demographic appreciated Dolcetto made without oak, but styles changed and wood barrels were added to the winemaking regime. In recent years, the trend has favored a return to the original Dolcetto, and wood use is today considered too invasive. This is a full and generous wine with dark fruit and hints of natural spiciness on the close.

#### 90 2021 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Piedmont Within Reach, Dec 2022

The 2021 Dolcetto d'Alba Coste & Fossati is laced with dark cherry, plum, spice, leather and tobacco. Long ferments, with submerged cap and aging in cask yields a Dolcetto of uncommon complexity and nuance. The Coste & Fossati is usually on the richer side, but the 2021 is decidedly restrained.

#### 92 2020 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Everyday Piedmont, Jan 2022

The 2020 Dolcetto d'Alba Coste & Fossati offers a bit more depth than the straight Dolcetto but with the energy that runs through all the 2020s here. Dark cherry fruit, leather, spice, tobacco and dried herbs lend notable complexity. This is beautifully done.

#### 91 **2022 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate: Barolo, Barbaresco & More, Apr 2024** Here's a pretty straightforward Dolcetto that starts off with lots of bold dark fruit but that also has the benefit of fine chalk and hints of flinty minerality. The 2022 Dolcetto d'Alba offers a little more complexity and aspires to more than just monotone blackberry. You get tart cherry and a hint of lilac or another blue flower. [...]

#### 91 2021 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Aug 2022

Made only in stainless steel, the 2021 Dolcetto d'Alba shows a purplish color with inky concentration. The bouquet is simple and direct with loads of sweet candied cherry, crème de cassis and bitter almond. This is another terrific take on one of Piedmont's most versatile grapes.

#### 90 **2020 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Everyday Piedmont, Jan 2022**

The 2020 Dolcetto d'Alba is absolutely gorgeous. Bright red berry fruit, spice and floral accents all grace this energetic, vibrant, mid-weight Dolcetto. The Vajra Dolcetto is done entirely in steel. It is as classic as it gets. There's lovely freshness here.

### 2018 - Gary Walsh, The Wine Front, May 2020

Blue and purple fruit, spice and flowers, some liquorice. It's medium-bodied, stony feel and distinctly 'mineral' acidity, tannin is slightly raw and sticky, but it's still pretty much a baby, and it finishes firm and long, shining with some red fruit as it goes. Such crunch and energy here. It's a very appealing wine.

- 90 **2018 Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Piedmont: Beyond the usual suspects, Mar 2020** The 2018 Dolcetto d'Alba is a super-classic wine loaded with varietal flavors to match its mid-weight structure. Soaring aromatics and plush red and purplish berry fruit come through loud and clear in this refreshing, supremely delicious Dolcetto from the Vajra family. This is such a gorgeous wine.
- 16.5 **2017 Richard Hemming MW, Jancis Robinson, Another piece of Piemonte, Jul 2018** Leathery and tart on the nose with lots of tannic fuzz on the palate. Very punchy for Dolcetto, even considering its youth. Lots of chew on the finish. Substantial and aromatic.

Offering a level of aromatic clarity and elegance that is not always easy for this grape, the G.D. Vajra 2022 Barbera d'Alba Superiore Viola delle Viole has beautiful aromas of earthy iris, gentle oak spice, toasted allspice and a very ripe or soft quality of fruit. It all balances out smoothly to the senses. The tannins are tucked softly within that texture to good effect, giving support but no harshness. This is a well-made Superiore with both intensity and balance.

#### 17 2021 - Jancis Robinson, Dec 2023

This is so alive and glorious that I wanted to throw my head back and laugh with the sheer pleasure of it. The fruit is pulsing with purity, dripping with dark, shining, deep indigo and gentian 'blues'. Wild blackberry, violet, balsamic notes, black pepper etched into every silky soft fold of fruit and tannin. Incredible tannins – long and long and long, the texture of cashmere and cork bark. The finish is succulent, like a long kiss. It carries its alcohol with graceful ease. Real beauty here.

#### 93 2021 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Italy, Piedmont: Barolo, Barbaresco & More Aug 2023

I'm told that this is probably the last vintage in which the 2021 Barbera d'Alba Superiore Viola delle Viole will carry the name Viola delle Viole. In yet another unfortunate nod to climate change, Barbera vines suffer from the floral disease Flavescence dorée that causes the plants to shut down and the fruit to remain unripened. [...] As a result, Barbera vines in Bricco delle Viole (one of two sites present in this blend, the other being Bricco Bertone outside the Barolo area) were taken out. Barbera tends to produce wines with high alcohol, but the Vajra team prefers to reach optimal fruit maturity and is less concerned about alcohol. The grape always has high acidity, but that is "a problem that is going away on its own," says Isidoro Vaira. Bricco delle Viole gives the wine its floral aromas and Bricco Bertone adds a sweet almond-like flavor. There is a seven- to eightday harvest difference between the two sites. This wine ages in large oak casks for 16 months.

#### 93+ 2021 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Piedmont Within Reach, Dec 2022

Just bottled, the 2021 Barbera d'Alba Superiore is fabuolous. Rich and inky, with tremendous depth, the 2021 is so vibrant in the glass. Red/purplish fruit, lavender, sweet spice and mocha are all dialed up, with a kiss of French oak that adds raciness.

#### 93+ 2020 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Everyday Piedmont, Jan 2022

The 2020 Barbera d'Alba Superiore emerges from Bricco Bertone in Sinio, just outside the Barolo zone. Black cherry, gravel, spice, menthol and leather confer gravitas to this very young Barbera. The Superiore has a track record of aging exquisitely. I wouldn't dream of touching a bottle anytime soon. This is one of the most under the radar wines in all of Piedmont.

#### 93+ 2017 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Lockdown Wines, Jul 2020

[...] The G.D. Vajra 2017 Barbera d'Alba Superiore Viola delle Viole opens to an inky almost impenetrable appearance. The bouquet opens to robust aromas of blackberry jam and cherry preserves. You feel the heat and richness of the vintage, and there's no way around it. [...] There is a point of almost-sweetness on the close followed by good acidity. A pairing with marinated or spicy barbecued meat might work best. [...]

The G.D. Vajra 2022 Barbera d'Alba is a nicely concentrated effort with dark cherry fruit, blackberry and cinnamon-like sensations from the grape skins. With that extra density comes extra fruit weight. The wine does carry muscle for sure, but the results are firm and tight.

Scents of lavender and violet lead into flavors of fleshy plum and blackberry that are infused with lively acidity and layered with notes of soft spice. Its taut plum-skin tannins frame the flavors and make this an excellent part ner for burgers or just about anything off the grill. - S.J.

The 2018 Barbera d'Alba is soft, juicy and uncomplicated, in other words, everything a value-priced Barbera should be. Sweet red cherry, plum, mocha, spice and licorice are front and center in this gorgeous, alluring Barbera from the Vajra family.



Bright acidity and tightly woven tannins provide support.

#### 92 2021 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate: Barolo, Barbaresco & More, Apr 2024

The G.D. Vajra 2021 Langhe Freisa Kyè has a delicate bouquet with intertwined berry and floral elements that could recall Japanese cherry blossom or even a Sicilian almond blossom. Beyond that, the wine offers an interlude of fresh blue fruits with elderberry and juniper. It shows terrific freshness and more tart flavors to close.

#### 93 2020 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Italy, Piedmont: Barolo, Barbaresco & More Aug 2023

The organic G.D. Vajra 2020 Langhe Freisa Kyè is like a postcard from Piedmont; it offers an authentic window onto the region and is a wine that most certainly could not be repeated in any other part of the world. Freisa is a tart, naturally spicy grape that displays dustings of powdery cinnamon and crushed white pepper. The grape is initially shy, and winemaking has it see two years in oak casks to help it integrate and flesh out. However, Freisa is another local variety that does well in an ever-warming climate. For example, this hot-vintage expression has an extra layer of complexity with dried herb or mint at the back.

#### 92 2019 - Monica Larner, Wine Advocate, Italy, Piedmont: Barolo, Barbaresco & More Aug 2023

The 2019 Langhe Freisa Kyè saw fruit harvested on the early side, and 5% whole clusters were used during fermentation to give the wine more depth and character. This vintage also saw a year of bottle age before its commercial release in order to give it more time to develop. "Freisa shares the character of the Piemontesi people," says Isidoro Vaira: "It needs time to come out." This wine offers a hint of dried herb or rosemary essence with dark fruit and spice. This vintage brought out the minty side of the variety.

#### 93+ 2019 - Antonio Galloni, Vinous, Piedmont Within Reach, Dec 2022

The 2019 Langhe Freisa Kyè is a gorgeous, exquisite wine. Picking a bit earlier has resulted in a Freisa that emphasizes energy over the more dense style that was in place here prior to 2015. Orange zest, raspberry, mint, sage and dried herbs. The style is more Nebbiolo-like than the more deep, concentrated and at times rustic Freisas of the past.

Dark cherry, almond, new leather, crushed rock, pulls to some brighter raspberry and strawberry flavours, a little spice too. Long and stuffed with earth and black tea-like things. Super. Well, it is for me, because I love this grape variety.

This is one of my favorite go-to wines for informal nights with family and friends. The G.D. Vajra 2022 Langhe Nebbiolo Claré J.C. opens to a lean appearance with bright ruby highlights. It remains true to the grape, in simple or almost transparent terms, with fresh berry fruit, cassis, blue flower and iris. I love the punchy, electric quality of this wine and its streamlined approach. You'll love it too (and love the low shelf price).

# 93 2022 - Eric Guido, Vinous, A Kaleidoscope of Colors: New Rosé Releases, May 2023

A profoundly complex blend of crushed blackberries, violets, spice orange peels and sage makes the 2022 Nebbiolo Clarè J.C. a total knockout on the nose. Silky and enveloping with a pretty inner sweetness up front, this impresses further as a wave of wild berry fruit and exotic spice slowly saturates the palate. The 2022 finishes lightly structured yet full of mouth-watering tension. Licorice and purple-toned inner florals gradually fade. Its deep red color and tremendous depth make it hard to classify the Clarè J.C. as a Rosé. That said, its drinkability factor is of f the charts.

#### 93 2022 - Kerin O'Keefe, kerinokeefe.com, Feb 2023

Made with the firm's youngest Nebbiolo vines and bottled right after fermentation, this youthful, fragrant red is an absolute charmer. Fermented with 20% whole clusters, it's loaded with aromas and flavors of succulent cherry, strawberry and savory spice notes including white pepper. It's crisp, with a light hint of fizz that lends even more energy. Slightly chilled, it will make for a great summer red or an aperitivo.

This wine is a stroke of genius and is quickly becoming an icon of the entry-level category of Italian wines. The G.D. This hearty, potent red has a ton to offer.

TIn the bottle with the light blue label, this is a blend of 70% Barbera and 30% Freisa. This is another terrific value wine from G.D. Vajra. The 2021 Piemonte Barbera Freisa reveals floral tones, crushed rose, wild fruit, spice and white pepper. This is the kind of super popular wine that sells out before I can write my review. The low sticker price makes this an irresistible deal.

From the pioneer of Riesling in Piedmont, the perfumed G.D. Vajra Pétracine has aromas of white spring flower, yellow stone fruit and citrus notes. M grapes cultivated in the Fossati cru in Barolo in a plot with gravel soil, and from a vineyard in Bricco Bertone in Sinio, it's linear, elegant and savory, flavors peach, apricot and orange zest before closing on a saline note. Tangy acidity lifts the finish.

The 2022 Riesling Pétracine is a beautiful white that marries varietal notes with the natural richness of the year. Sweet jasmine, tangerine peel, ginger, passionfruit and lemon confit lend exotic beauty to Vajra's Riesling in 2022. I imagine time in bottle will bring out more of the textual oiliness that is in the background at present.

The organic G.D. Vajra 2022 Langhe Riesling Pétracine (the name is hard to read against the grapevine design that surrounds the lettering on the front label) is very direct and bright with a sharp citrusy quality that pops out thanks to crushed stone and tropical fruits. This glossy, smooth-sailing wine is a lot of fun to drink (especially young).

The 2021 Riesling Pétracine is soft, open-knit and quite tasty, with pretty tropical accents that play off more varietal orchard fruit, mint and floral notes. Drink this refreshing, elegant white over the next handful of years.

The 2020 Riesling Pétracine is fresh, vibrant and full of energy. Orchard fruit, mint, lime, crushed rocks and white flowers are all very nicely delineated. Weightless and bright, the Riesling feels especially taut in 2020. It's a style that is hugely appealing.

What makes it so good? There are three unique qualities that we should cherish. Firstly, it really does smell and taste of grapes, unlike almost all other wines, and grapes taste delicious. Secondly, it has only 5.5% alcohol, which makes it drinkable with abandon. (Indeed, those first two points are closely related, since the interrupted fermentation process that keeps the alcohol low also retains those pure, unconverted grape flavours.) Thirdly, it is frizzante, which is not only an excellent word, but indicates a lightly sparkling style that I can't think of in any other wine.

The result is a foaming glass of sheer, unadulterated joy that I challenge anyone to drink without a smile.

#### 90+ 2019 - Monica Larner, The Wine Advocate, Lockdown Wines, Jul 2020

This pretty semi-sparkling Moscato d'Asti produces a thick foam of bubbles as it pours into the glass and boasts a luminous pale gold color. The G.D. Vajra 2019 Moscato d'Asti sees fruit sourced from the Vigneti di Moncucco in Santo Stefano Belbo and the Riforno vineyard in the nearby area of Mango. Both sites are at the historic heart of the Moscato d'Asti production zone. This pretty wine delivers a wide range of floral and tropical fruit aromas with fragrant peach and star jasmine. There are delicate background notes of crushed stone or oyster shell.

It opens heady aromas of rose, pomegranate, Alpine herb and saline. Vibrant and loaded with finesse, the linear, savory palate features juicy strawberry blood o star anise and saline. An elegant perlage and bright acidity keep it energized and balanced.

90 **NV - Stephanie Johnson, Wine&Spirits, Mar 2024** This wine combines the fruitiness of pinot noir with nebbiolo's savory edge in a crisp and refreshing rosé sparkler. Light tannins frame flavors of summer strawberry and cranberry with just a hint of toasted nuts.

## 91 NV - Eric Guido, Vinous, 2022 Rosé – New Releases, May 2022

The NV, Extra Brut Rosé Metodo Classico N.S. delle Neve is caprivating with a beguiling bouquet that leads with sweet tobacco, then transforms to show ripe peaches, chamomile and hints of raw almond. It's silky-smooth with a fine bead of bubbles, as tension quickly mounts through a wave of saline-tinges acids and minerals that cut through with laser-like intensity. A salty flourish defines the finale, while the palate is left watering for more. This is intense on its own, but it would be dreamy with any number of rich, fatty or fried foods.

Soft and giving, it balances exotic spice with crisp orchard fruits and citrus while cleaning up beautifully through the close. Trace's of green apples and minerals linger and keep me looking back to the glass for more. The Rosabella is a blend Nebbiolo, Barbera and Dolcetto.

#### 90 2021 - Eric Guido, Vinous, 2022 Rosé – New Releases, May 2022

The 2021 Rosato Rosabella is so understated yet pretty, capturing the eyewith its pale pink color, and then the senses with nuances of rose, strawberries and a dusting of spice. This leaves he palate completely refreshed, as a salty flourish punctuates the experience quite nicely.


